



Cabo22 is just around the corner and we can't wait to see you at the beautiful Hyatt Ziva Los Cabos! Here is some important information to review before arriving.

### **General Information**

### **Weather**

Average temperatures in Cabo San Lucas Mexico range between 68 and 75 degrees Fahrenheit in the month of March. The combination of temperature and moisture can result in very humid days, so be sure to dress comfortable for both heat and rain.

### **What to Pack**

Attire for the event is resort casual. For dining in the restaurants at the Hyatt Ziva, evening casual with closed shoes or sandals for gentlemen are required. No beach attire, tank tops, baseball caps, or flip-flops are permitted.

### **Arrival at the Airport**

Upon arrival you may deboard through a jetway, or you may have to descend a set of stairs onto the tarmac before entering the terminal. It's a good idea to wear layers in preparation for Los Cabos' warm weather. Inside the terminal, you will have a few steps to follow before you can get your transportation to your hotel.

- Pass through immigration and show your documents, including your passport and the immigration form (FMM), also referred to as a [tourist card](#), that you should have filled out on the plane.

- After immigration, continue to the baggage carousel area to pick up your checked luggage.

After you pass through customs, there's one more hurdle to get through before you reach the exit. You have to walk through what is sometimes called the "shark tank" which is an area where many timeshare representatives will try to get your attention. Their goal is to get you to attend a timeshare presentation and they can be very pushy and sometimes even deceptive. They will offer to help you find your transportation, give you special discounts, deals or free activities in exchange for attending a timeshare sales pitch. **Just walk directly through this area without paying attention to the salespeople and get outside, where the taxis and transportation companies wait.**

### **Public Transportation and Taxis**

For transportation from the airport to your hotel or resort, it's a good idea to schedule your transfer in advance either through your hotel or with a reputable transportation company such as one of the following:

Taxis tend to be pricey and Uber drivers can't pick up passengers at the airport. If you're not too loaded with luggage, another alternative is offered by the bus service Ruta Del Desierto which is inexpensive and used mainly by locals. You can catch the bus from Terminal 1, just go up one flight from the arrival lobby to the departures area, out the door and turn left. You will see the bus stop. From Terminal 2, go up one floor to the Departures Level. There's an escalator that goes upstairs (look to the left after passing the timeshare sales vendors). Up top, exit the doors and go outside; you'll see the bus stop by the curb to the right, at the far end of the terminal. The buses are purple and yellow and have "Ruta del Desierto" printed in large letters on the side of the bus.

### **Time Zone**

Cabo San Lucas is Mountain Standard Time.

### **Currency**

The peso is the national currency, although US dollars are widely accepted in businesses throughout both towns. Change is made on pesos. The exchange is around 12-13 pesos to one US dollar. Major credit cards are accepted in most establishments; but ask before you order, as not all restaurants and stores accept all of them, some may only accept cash. [More in the currency](#) section.

### **ATMs and Banks**

ATM cash machines accept foreign debit and credit cards and dispense cash in pesos and is the easiest and cheapest way to obtain money from your foreign account.

### **Electricity**

Mexico operates on the same 110-volt current as of the United States, so electrical adapters are not needed, sometimes you will need a 3-prong adapter, as many plugs here only have space for the two-prong plugs.

### **Daily All-Inclusive Pass**

If you are staying OFF PROPERTY you will need to purchase a wrist band for \$150 upon arrival at the front desk for a daily all-inclusive pass at the Hyatt Ziva. This wrist band is required to come on property at the hotel and will allow you access to all scheduled events, all hotel restaurants and bars from 9:00am - 11:00pm.
